**BURN BANS LIFTED FOR PIERCE AND SNOHOMISH COUNTIES;  
DARRINGTON BURN BAN ELEVATED TO STAGE 2**

**SEATTLE, WA** – All burn bans are lifted in Pierce and Snohomish counties, effective 12pm today, Monday, November 30th. Darrington’s burn ban is being elevated to Stage 2, effective 12pm today and will be lifted at 8am tomorrow, Tuesday December 1st.

With a weak front this evening coming from the south, we expect air pollution to mix out in most areas. However, with this morning’s high levels in Darrington and the late arrival of the front there, the Puget Sound Clean Air Agency doesn’t expect relief in Darrington until tomorrow morning.
